I want to thank the citizens of Bolton for their continued support in our efforts to continue with the Community Policing philosophy that has been so successful. Our goal is provide you with the best possible police service. We appreciate the efforts made by the Board of Selectmen, the Advisory Committee and the Personnel Committee to make this department as professional as possible.

The department hired three new Reserve Intermittent Police Officers, Tim Charland, Alana Santillo and Luke Hamburger. We have also added two part-time relief dispatchers this year, Theodore Staake and David Byler. Chief Celia Hyde has retired after thirty years of dedicated service to the Bolton Police Department and we wish her well. Officer Ian Spencer has resigned to take a position with the Lincoln Police Department and Reserve Officer Alana Santillo resigned for personal reasons.

The Police Chief Search Committee is working diligently to narrow the candidates for the Board of Selectmen to interview, and the board hopes to have the new Chief on board early in the spring. The Police Station Study Committee is still working to help us find a home for a new station, which is badly needed.

We have had several grants to support the Governor's Highway Safety Bureau 'Click-It or Tick-It' campaign for seat belt and child safety seat compliance as well as 'You Drink You Drive You Lose' Campaign for drunk drivers. Sgt. Andrew Bagdonas and Highway Superintendent Harold Brown are working together with the Public Ways Safety Committee to improve our traffic signs throughout the town, and signal lights, street lighting and sidewalks along Main Street.
