The Board of Registrars is responsible for registering voters, and keeping the voting list and annual street list. In Bolton we do a true census count each year. The information obtained from the census is used directly in preparing the street list and annual register of voters and in updating the voting list. It is also used in preparing the school list, the list of dog owners, and the lists required by the juror selection system. It may also be used to establish eligibility for residents' tuition at state colleges, for veterans' benefits from the town, for senior citizen programs and other benefits. State law requires the street list contain name, address, date of birth, occupation and whether or not a person is a citizen. The Police, Fire and Ambulance squads use this information extensively when responding to a call for help. Bolton used the personal touch by canvassing by phone for the last time in 1995. Too many people were not at home or had answering machines screen their calls and too many follow-ups had to be mailed anyway. Please be prompt in returning your forms.

Residents may register to vote during business hours at the Town Clerk's office in the Town Hall or register to vote by mail. In Bolton, mail-in forms are available at the post office, the library, and Nashoba Regional High School main office, as well as at the Town Hall. You may call 978-779-2771 for further information.
